Rangeland Weed Management | Dr. Jane Mangold *Pesticide Credits Avαilαble Ventenata is an increasing problem on rangeland in Montana, including southcentral to southeastern parts of the state. This presentation will focus on the identification, biology, and ecology of ventenata and present results from Montana-based research on how to manage it.

Forage Seeding and Stand Establishment | Dr. Hayes Goosey Seeding annual and perennial forage species can be a delicate process. This presentation will discuss practices that increase seedling establishment and set up forage fields for years of quality production.
