Montana 4-H People Partner grants - due February 1

These grants provide incentives and financial support to groups and individuals for programs that enhance the quality of living for people in their communities.

Application Deadline: Postmarked by February 1st Each application is eligible for up to \$500.

Eligibility

4-H groups and individual members may apply. Grants are also open to non-4-H youth groups and individuals. Applications should meet the following criteria:

- Youth should be involved in determining, planning, conducting, and evaluating the project.
- Project will make it possible for people to accomplish something educational and worthwhile that helps them reach a higher quality of life.
- There is community support and acceptance of the project, as evidence by "partners" listed in the grant application, additional funding sources, and resource persons and agencies involved.
- The project has lasting benefits.

Even though only January 1st, it's time to start thinking about the 2025 Multi-County 4-H Camp! 4-H members who are 4-H ages 14 (as of October 1, 2024) and will be in grades 9—12 (for the 2024-25 school year), please consider applying to be a camp counselor. It is a great learning experience and a lot of fun! 4-H Camp will be June 24-27, 2025, at the Montana Farmer's Union Camp near Highwood. Counselors will help plan the camp, will lead workshops and games, and oversee the campers in their cabins.

Applicants need to submit a completed application by February 7 via Zsuite including a cover letter and resume. Selected counselors will need to attend two mandatory camp counselor workshops on March 2nd and April 13th and pay a \$25 fee to help offset meals and t-shirt expenses. MONTANA WINTER FAIR - AG AMBASSADOR COMPETITION 2025

Visit https://www.montanawinterfair.com/events/ag-ambassador-contest to register This event is open to ANY junior high or high school student. All components of this event except the prepared speech may be completed remotely.

As part of the event, students are asked to tell the story of agriculture through a variety of methods. For 2025, participants should focus on the topic of Agriculture in a Changing World. The prompt is intentionally broad because we want to encourage students to be creative. Examples of topics students can focus on include changes being made on their own/family farm/ranch, changes in the industry, new technology available, etc.

The prizes awarded for the competition are as follows:

- Prepared Speech (delivered in person): 1st Place \$150, 2nd Place \$75
- Newspaper Article: 1st Place \$100, 2nd Place \$50
- Radio Spot: 1st Place \$100, 2nd Place \$50
- Social Media Posts: 1st Place \$100, 2nd Place \$50

The newspaper, radio, and social media posts will be completely virtual, but the prepared speech will be an in-person event, to be delivered in Lewistown during the Winter Fair on January 18th.

- Newspaper Article completely virtual 500-800 words, due January 12
- Radio Spot completely virtual 50-60 seconds long, pre-recorded and due January 12
- Social Media Posts completely virtual 3 posts on any appropriate platform, including a picture or video (max. 60 sec/video), and posts written using 60 words or less; due Jan. 12
- Prepared Speech 7-12 minutes, delivered in person in Lewistown on the day of the competition
