

Want to make your meetings more
fun and engaging for your club?

lowa State Extension 4-H has developed a great way to gamify your club meetings with the *Listening Beads Game*. In a nutshell, each person at the meeting is given a small item, like a bead, that is placed on the table in front of them and is assigned a word to listen for. Each person is assigned one word only. When a person hears "their" word, they get up and take the bead from that person who said the word. At the end of the meeting, the person with the most beads wins. We have lots of items that could be substituted for beads at the Extension Office.
