## **4-H RECORD BOOKS**

4-H would not be the same without records. They're an important part of completing each project. They help set goals, keep track of attendance at meetings, record demonstrations and talks and a whole lot more.

**NOW IS THE TIME TO START YOUR RECORDS.** You should have a My 4-H Year record sheet and record sheets for each Department A (animal) and N (non-animal) project. This month be certain you have completed the goals section on each of your record sheets.

It is important to work on records all year long. It is easier to write down what you have accomplished as soon as you do it. This also means less work at the end of the year. Remember to record both "What I did AND what I learned" each time you make an entry in your journal.

An easy way to continuously add to your records is to do them electronically in ZSuite or on the <u>Yellowstone County 4-H</u> website at https://www.montana.edu/extension/yellowstone/4h/recordsheets.html

You will need to download and save the file and then you can type information into the records each time you have something to add.

4-H Service Learning is...a volunteer service that you provide with no monetary compensation. It is hands-on involvement with community projects.

Examples of community service:

- Volunteering at your church as an usher, teaching Sunday School, directing the Children's church.
- Volunteering at a nursing home helping the residents.
- Volunteering at the local hospital as a Candy Striper.
- Volunteering at the Rescue Mission serving food, stocking the food pantry, cleaning tables, etc.
- Volunteering in your school, picking up garbage around the campus, helping with school functions like PTA events.
- Volunteering in the community cleaning up and beautifying parks, picking up garbage in ditches, cleaning graffiti off buildings.

- Organizing and implementing work crews for various projects around your community, painting a house, mowing a yard or shoveling a sidewalk for a neighbor needing help.
- Relay for Life volunteering.
- Ringing the Salvation Army bells during the holidays.
- Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, and 4-H community service activities but if you are a member of the specific group/organization, hours spent fundraising do not count. (car wash fundraiser, selling cookies, popcorn, fruit, etc.)
   Participating members will be recognized at Family Fun Night and prizes will be given out based on the number of hours you volunteered during the 2025-2026 4-H year - September 1 to October 31. Sign up on in your ZSuite account under Events.

- 1. Be at least 21 years of age.
- 2. Be enrolled as a leader in their respective County. Passed a background check and successfully completed the Montana 4-H Volunteer Training Modules.
- All training attendees must complete the four National 4-H Shooting Sports modules in ZSuite to be certified
  at the end of the practicum day. The code for ZSuite will be shared with the leaders that sign up to take the
  trainings.
- 4. Be trained and certified in any discipline(s) that they are teaching at the county level.
- 5. Participants must attend the entire training and successfully complete all aspects to receive their respective discipline certification.
- 6. Certification is good for seven (7) years. If the discipline is not taught in the first 2 years, the course must be retaken.



## ARE YOU STARTING A NEW ANIMAL PROJECT THIS YEAR?

Questions to ask if you are starting a new animal project. There are many things you may not think or know to ask about your animal if you are planning on taking it to fair. Please talk with your organizational leader or project leader, see the county website for fair handbooks, and attend county workshops to help you find these answers. This information will help you have a successful project to exhibit at fair.



Is there a date I need to own my animal by?

Does it need to be tagged? If so, when? How/where do I get this done?

Have I taken a Quality Assurance class? Helmet Class for Horse?

Do I need to sign up for a specific project (example, breeding for market animals or obedience for dog) to be able to show it the way I want to at fair?

Are there weight restrictions for showing/selling this animal?

What will I need to know to show/sell this animal?

Are certain types of feed required?

Are all medicines OK to use?

What kind of housing will they require?

What could they require in extreme cold weather? Extreme hot weather? 14. What kind of exercise will my animal require? What kind of time commitment will I have to make to ensure I am doing everything this animal needs? (Just filling a self-feeder once a week or feeding twice a day and cleaning pen every other day?)

Will I need any special equipment to get my animal ready to show? (clippers, fitting stand, etc.)

As we get closer to fair you will need to know:

How do I fill out my registration to show this animal? What classes can I put them it?

When do I take my animal?

If it is a market animal, what are the requirements to sell?

What do I need to provide for my animal's stay at the barn? (feed pans, halter, woodchips, etc.)

What am I required to wear to show this animal?

If I am NOT selling my animal, when can I take them home?



All market beef you are planning to enter for the 2026 MontanaFair must be tagged on this date. There are no exceptions. Each exhibitor can tag three animals in each species. Exhibitors can enter all 3 in their MontanaFair entry, but at the fair they must decide which 2 animals they will be weighing and exhibiting. Each exhibitor at the MontanaFair can only sell one animal.



The Beef tagging date for 2026 will be **Sunday**, **JANUARY 4** from **12:00 to 3:00 pm** at PAYS.

All exhibitors at the MontanaFair in Department A (livestock) are required to attend an MSU Extension Animal Quality Assurance Training prior to the MontanaFair entry deadline to be eligible to exhibit at the MontanaFair. Animal Quality Assurance Class will be from 1:00-2:30 pm and the Horse Helmet Class is from 3:00 am to 4:00 pm.

## 2025-2026 ANIMAL QUALITY ASSURANCE POLICY & WORKSHOP SCHEDULE

All 4–H and FFA members exhibiting any animal in Department A (Junior Livestock) at MontanaFair are required to attend an MSU Extension ANIMAL QUALITY ASSURANCE TRAINING (AQA) (per state guidelines) provided by the 4-H Committee or an FFA Advisor/Agriculture Educator prior to the first MontanaFair entry deadline or exhibitors do not show. Yellowstone County has two 4-H age brackets for AQA training. Exhibitors must attend AQA as Beginners/Juniors (4-H age 8-13), and as a senior member (4-H age 14-19). This age is based on the exhibitors "4-H Age" – the age as of October 1 of the current 4-H year. Exhibitors must take Animal Quality Assurance the first year they reach each age bracket or the first year they are exhibiting in an animal project. All classes will include the same teaching materials and use the same forms and paperwork. Class content is determined by a committee and updated every two years. A parent or legal guardian must also attend the AQA Training.

There will be hands-on, group activities. Please plan on arriving on time with a parent with both staying for the complete 1½ hours. If you and your parent are not in attendance for the <u>complete</u> training, you may be asked to attend another session. Plan on attending a session early in the year so conflicts do not occur in your family schedule. **More workshops will NOT be added after the June 3 class. It is the final opportunity for 2026.** 

The sessions in January, March and May are in person trainings. For the virtual sessions, people will log into the Webex meeting (Webex link information will be sent out via email prior to each session) to learn the information then go to the online program, pay their own \$12 fee, and take the online class. A copy of the completion certificate must be provided to the Extension Office.

## MSU EXTENSION 4-H HORSE HELMET POLICY & WORKSHOP SCHEDULE

Participants in the 4-H Horse Project are required to attend a Horse Helmet Workshop once as a beginner/junior 4-H member (8-13) and again as a senior 4-H member (14 and up). This age is based on the exhibitors "4-H Age" — the age as of October 1 of the current 4-H year. Exhibitors must attend a Horse Helmet Workshop the first year they reach every age bracket or the first year they are exhibiting in an animal project. A parent or legal guardian must also attend the Horse Helmet Workshop.

After attending a 4-H Helmet Workshop, riders may choose whether they will wear a certified helmet. It is the responsibility of the parent or guardian of the 4-H member to see that the headgear worn complies with such standards and is in good condition. The Montana 4-H Center for Youth Development encourages the use of ASTM certified/SEI approved safety helmets in all equine events. Protective headgear may be used in all classes and shall not be discriminated against. Helmet use is encouraged in all 4-H horse activities any time a 4-H member is around a horse. A certified equestrian helmet with safety harness fastened in place is required in over fence classes and gymkhana events, activities, and practice sessions. Gymkhana refers to horseback speed events (timed or un-timed) that do not use livestock. Events that usually fall in this category include, but are not limited to barrel racing, pole bending, keyhole races, stake races, rescue races, pony express race, etc. Events that are not intended to be included in this policy are events such as calf roping, team roping, goat tying, and team penning that may be timed but use livestock. More workshops will NOT be added after the May 2 class. It is the final opportunity for 2026.
