I am thrilled to report that MSU had an overwhelmingly positive outcome for our year-7 accreditation review by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities. Faculty and staff teams are already working in earnest on the three recommendations provided by the external peer review committee. Leading the way is the newly assembled Advising Assessment Task Force, comprised of faculty from each college and professional advisors from Advising Commons. The task force is meeting regularly this semester to assess MSU's current processes and build a tailored plan to enhance advising outcomes for all students.

Another cause for celebration is our steady progress in student persistence to degree completion. Four-year graduation rates continue to improve as more students continue their college education from Fall to Spring semester for the third consecutive year. Preliminary counts indicate we will pass the 93% mark for student retention from Fall to Spring semester. Wow –that's a great team effort– thank you!

Congratulations to the award winners and thank you for your hard work. As we celebrate these achievements, we are reminded that our history inspires us, and our collective efforts will continue to propel MSU to new heights.
